### **A regional conference on Censorship and West African Music**

### **C.1 Tanzanian Cultural Policy**

The Tanzanian culture policy, 'Sera Ya Utamaduni', is compiled in Swahili. With which the Ministry of Education and Culture directly puts its primary objective into actual practice: promoting publications in the country's language.

Not only the language is part of Tanzania's cultural heritage, but also the shipwrecks that are centuries old found lying along the coast and all monuments that are more than a century old. The culture policy emphasises the educational and tourist values of these treasures and uses culture to serve social development. What is more, every Tanzanian has the right to enjoy culture, and a network of community centres enables them to make their own art. Radio and television are required to devote airspace to Tanzanian productions and music.

In the first phase of the programme the organisers formed the InterACT network of 13 partner non-governmental organisations (NGOs), and the Accra Teacher Training College. 45 NGO staff and teacher trainees were trained in the use of interactive theatre as a tool for changing behaviour around HIV/AIDS.

## **D.2 AIDS in Africa: Three scenarios to 2025**

This new report by UNAIDS, presents three possible case studies for how the AIDS epidemic in Africa could evolve over the next 20 years based on policy decisions taken today by African leaders and the rest of the world.

The scenarios set out to answer one central question: 'Over the next 20 years, what factors will drive Africa's and the world's responses to the AIDS epidemic, and what kind of future will there be for the next generation?'

It stresses that local decentralized responses are critical: it is vital to include local culture, values, and meanings in shaping policies. Religious identity is also likely to play a major role in the future of the continent and the epidemic.

"At a meeting in Madrid this past weekend, representatives of more than 70 countries gathered to rally support behind the text of the [UNESCO] Convention [on the Protection of the Diversity of Cultural Contents and Artistic Expressions], a clear sign of the building momentum. . . . The final draft text of the Convention agreed to in Paris revolved around Canada's three principal objectives: [1] The Convention recognizes the dual nature of cultural goods and services as having both an economic and social value; [2]The Convention reaffirms the right of states to take measures in support of cultural expression; and [3] The Convention is supportive and on equal footing with other international agreements and not subordinated by these agreements. "
