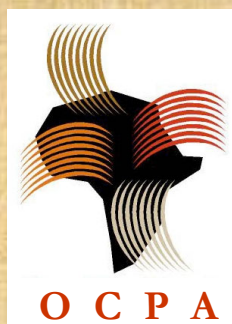


Observatory of Cultural Policies in Africa

B.3 Review Sauti za Busara Swahili Music Festival, Zanzibar, February 2005

The second edition of the festival, music from the Swahili-speaking world was showcased in a diverse line up of forty groups and more than 450 artists mostly from East Africa. As well as featuring a broad array of music from Zanzibar, Tanzania, Kenya and Uganda, artists from Egypt, Yemen, Zimbabwe and Rwanda took part in the event, which must be the greatest celebration of Swahili music and culture that has taken place in the world to date.

The event was most of all a celebration of Swahili culture – its historical traditions were acknowledged with Nadi Ikhwan Safaa (Malindi Taarab Orchestra) from Zanzibar who celebrate one hundred years of playing music this year.

B.4 Harare International Festival of the Arts (Hifa)

The Festival had its official opening on Monday 25 April, and the Programme started in earnest on Tuesday 26 April 2005.

This year's Festival comes in the wake of the country's 25th Anniversary of Independence celebrations. The multi disciplinary Festival was established in 1999 by a young Zimbabwean, Manuel Bagorro, himself a classical pianist of renown. Since then, Hifa has grown from strength to strength. Each year the Festival has been better than the previous year, which has posed a real challenge for the organisers, forcing them to strive for better each time. Last year an international journalist pronounced it one of the best organised Festivals in the world, coming pretty close to the great Edinburgh Festival. Needless to say the problems of organising such a Festival are immense, but it is inspired by a strong vision of the role of the arts, and indeed of culture itself in social transformation. The Festival's success is largely due to its very solid partnerships with the Zimbabwe Corporate world, some international NGOs and foreign embassies located in Harare, who all rise to the occasion each year. It is heartening that the Government of Zimbabwe has continued to provide the necessary enabling environment, even though Hifa is an entirely private initiative, with no government input whatsoever

B.6 Nouvelles richesses archéologiques découvertes à Axoum

Paris, 25 avril - Des richesses archéologiques insoupçonnées ont été découvertes par les experts que l'UNESCO a envoyés la semaine dernière à Axoum (Ethiopie). Ils avaient pour mission d'évaluer le terrain de ce site de la Liste du patrimoine mondial, en vue de l'érection de son obélisque qui se trouvait à Rome depuis 1937. La troisième et dernière partie de la stèle, d'un poids total de 160 tonnes et d'une hauteur de 24,6 mètres, est arrivée ce matin à l'aéroport d'Axoum.

Selon les experts, il s'agit d'une nécropole royale de différentes dynasties pré-chrétiennes, qui se prolonge bien au-delà des limites actuelles de la zone archéologique située aux pieds des monts Saint-Georges et Mariam
