Wal Fadjri (Dakar) par Khady OUSMANE (Stagiaire)

Créée depuis 1982 à Abidjan comme projet de l'Institut international africain basé à Londres, l'Organisation non gouvernementale régionale Wamp a son siège désormais à Dakar, Sénégal. L'accord de siège correspondant a été signé le 28 Juillet entre la direction du Wamp et le ministère des Affaires étrangères du Sénégal.

Ayant pour mission de soutenir le développement des musées et les professionnels du patrimoine culturel en Afrique de l'Ouest, le Wamp vise, selon son directeur exécutif, 'à contribuer au renforcement des capacités et à assister les musées et institutions assimilées'. 07-08-2006 (Addis Ababa)

Librarians from across Africa have launched an information exchange network to promote access to, and more effective use of, government information for democratic and economic development on the continent, following a workshop in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

Workshop had been co-sponsored by the International Federation of Library Associations (IFLA) and the U.N. Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA).

The Access to Information Network-Africa (AINA) will act as a forum for exchanging information and discussing strategies for implementing the recommendations of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) in Africa.

The network emerged out of a workshop held on 27-30 March 2006, which brought together more than 80 library science professionals, U.N. representatives and academics from across the continent. The conference agreed on an Action Framework to implement the WSIS recommendations relating to libraries, archives and other information services at the local, national and pan-African levels.

The same holds true for Henry Moore, acclaimed for his Reclining Figures, which he had seen in Mexican sculptures.

The Picassos and Moores of the world as well as their originals will remain imprisoned in a colonial box until the story has been written from the other perspective.
