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A. News about OCPA and its Web Site/Nouvelles sur OCPA et sur son site internet

A.1 Activities of the OCPA Secretariat

The OCPA Secretariat has been very active the last weeks in particular in mobilising a significant partnership.

- a. On March 18, the Executive Director, Lupwishi Mbuyamba, organised at the OCPA offices in Maputo a meeting with an official delegation of the Ministry of culture of Mozambique lead by the National Deputy Director, Dr Solange Macamo. The subject of the encounter was to examine the situation of cultural heritage of the country after the damages caused by the floods and the passage of the cyclone Vazio along the Indian ocean coast with a view of evaluation of damages and prepare a strategy for rehabilitation.

b. On March 20, the Executive Director participated in a meeting in the Department of Arts and Culture in Pretoria, South Africa. The harmonisation and strengthening of music associations in the country were in the focus of the meeting with a view to prepare the representation of this category of artists producers and industrials in the international bodies such as the International Music Council of UNESCO and in the Panafrican events like FESPAM in Brazzaville and MASA in Abidjan. It was examined on this occasion the ways for OCPA to facilitate the interactions and the exchanges with relevant institutions and initiatives in the continent. Other crucial issues were explored such as art education in the curriculum in public education and the national observatory of cultural policy of South Africa.

The Executive Director was accompanied at this meeting by Professor Caroline Van Niekerk of the Pretoria University and Mr Herman Van Niekerk of the University of Johannesburg. The Chief Director of Cultural Development, Mr Tale Motsepe and Glenn Ujebe Masokoane, Director of Multi-Disciplinary Programme were host of the meeting.

- c. The same day, the Executive Director was invited at a concertation with Mr Brett Peyper, Head of the Department of Arts and Cultural Heritage of the Witwatersrand University in Johannesburg. Mr Peyper expressed his appreciation of the work in progress at OCPA and in particular the information bulletin OCPA News offering possibilities to illustrate and support training sessions on cultural policy at the University. He invited the Executive Director to deliver open lectures at the University and proposed a strategy for a permanent co-operation between his Department and OCPA. The Executive Director accepted to consider this invitation and indicated that this will be extended to the OCPA network. He presented to Mr Peyper the last OCPA publication of the Compendium of Reference Documents on cultural policies in Africa.
- d. The first week of April, the Executive Director attended the AMERICA CANTAT, the Vth festival of choral music in Havana, Cuba. On this occasion, he went on technical visit at the Research Center of the National Cuban Music Institute and visited studios and archives of the center. He was then given to appreciate the survival of African traditional music and its impact on the Cuban traditional music. Elements for joint research and joint production were considered and the participation of Cuban experts in the musical events in African continent-and vice versa-considered.

In addition, with the First Vice Minister of Culture of Cuba, Dr Rafael Bernal Alemany, it was discussed the possibility for OCPA to provide an input in the forthcoming International Congress on Culture and Development on the theme "defending cultural diversity".

- e. Mr Pedro Cossa, the administration officer received on April 3rd, on working visit at the OCPA Secretariat, Ms Kane, Officer for culture at USIS (United States Information Services) in Mozambique. The purpose of the

visit was to examine the possibility for the US representation to be involved in the project initiated by OCPA for an assistance in the rehabilitation of the damaged cultural heritage in Mozambique.

In this context, it was announced that the Prince Claus Fund (The Hague, Netherlands) within the framework of its programme CER (culture emergency relief) the Prince Claus Fund has agreed to support the organisation, in April 2007, of two field missions to the Gaza and Inhambane Provinces for the evaluation of the damages caused by the natural disaster to Chaimite and Manyikeni monuments.

Under the theme Culture, Development and Euro - African Co-operation, this Seminar is meant to review and the on-going and future co-operation projects launched jointly by the two organisations concerning the following activities

- The research project on regional and local cultural policies in Africa.

B. News, events and projects in Africa

B.1 National Arts Festival

Grahamstown South Africa 28 June - 7 July 2007

The National Arts Festival is one of the most important event on the South African cultural calendar, and the biggest annual celebration of the arts on the African continent.

Starting at the end of June/beginning of July, it runs for between 8 and 10 days and is held in the small university city of Grahamstown, which is situated in the Eastern Cape, 130km from Port Elizabeth.

The National Arts Festival is South Africa's cultural crucible where current trends and future directions in the arts can be observed. With the demise of but a handful of production houses the commissioning of new works and exhibitions by the National Arts Festival plays a vital role towards sustaining the growth of South African arts. It offers the established artist significant public exposure and unknown talent the opportunity for discovery. Many productions launched to acclaim in Grahamstown go on to have lengthy runs in other centres, and in this way the festival plays a crucial role in determining the nation's arts diary.

B.2 Botswana workshop on the Draft National Action Plan on Culture 08 March, 2007

Gaborone - The Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Youth Sports and Culture, Ms Tickey Pule says effective nurturing and exploitation of culture can contribute to job creation, income generation and poverty alleviation.

She said that is why it is important that an effective policy on culture is put in place in order to take advantage of this potential source of economic development. Botswana has a rich cultural heritage and an inexhaustible pool of creative talent which is relevant for the development of cultural industries.

Ms Pule explained that the Cultural Action Plan will be an implementation strategy for cultural development in Botswana and will reinforce existing efforts being undertaken by the different stakeholders. She said she was optimistic that after its completion, the document will assist the government to fully utilise one of the potential sectors in the overall economic development of Botswana.

The National Action Plan will provide a framework through which culture can be preserved, promoted and nurtured.

After the inaugural exhibition at the Africa Centre in December 2007, it will be hosted at the Johannesburg Art Gallery in May 2008 for three months and then move to the Durban Art Museum in September 2008; it is also intended, in some form, to travel to other cities and towns which do not often have access to exhibitions of this nature.

The artist development programme for both rural and urban artists aims to identify and assist 30 artists in developing new skills to be better able to participate in events such as the Contemporary and the broader art arena.

C.1 Zimbabwe: National Cultural Policy Document Launched

The Herald (Harare), March 30, 2007

Zimbabweans should venture into manufacturing of cultural products to save foreign currency being used in the importation of the commodities, Vice President Joice Mujuru has said.

Cde Mujuru said various people, mostly artists, could contribute significantly to the economic development of the country in the production of the products.

The document, which was compiled by the Ministry of Education, Sport and Culture after extensive consultation with all stakeholders who include artists, was officially presented to Dr Utete-Masango on behalf of Cde Mujuru by the Minister of Education, Sport and Culture, Cde Aeneas Chigwedere, at Prince Edward School.

The Ministry of Education, Sport and Culture and the National Arts Council should encourage artists to develop and promote culture along the lines detailed in the cultural policy document, said Cde Mujuru.

Performing, visual and literary artists continued to shine like a beacon locally and internationally and a considerable amount of foreign currency had been realised through them, she said.

"The role of arts and culture is vital in building and transforming communities raising consciousness within societies on cultural and developmental challenges within the context of diversity and pluralism," said Cde Mujuru.

The South African Cultural Observatory is intended to be a platform from which to view the South African cultural landscape. The Cultural Observatory, initiated by the Directorate of Cultural Industries of the department of Arts and culture (DAC) focuses on the music, print media and publishing, film and video, craft and heritage sectors. Research on the visual, applied and performing arts will be included in the next phase.

In order to create a profile for each sector, the cultural observatory team decided to start by identifying the core problems of each area. This was accomplished through an extensive consultative process involving sectorial experts in the different fields. The process began with the development of 'problem trees'. Once the core problems were identified, these were transformed into core goals for each sector. These goals potentially form the basis for the development of sector objectives, the achievement of which, would hopefully solve its core problems and meet its goals.

C3 African Model Legislation for the Protection of the Right of Local Communities, Farmers and Breeders, and for the Regulation of Access to Biological Resources

The main objectives of this model law is to

- a) recognize, protect and support the inalienable rights of local communities including farming communities over their biological resources, knowledge and technologies;
- b) recognize and protect the rights of breeders;
- c) provide an appropriate system of access to biological resources, community knowledge and technologies subject to the prior informed consent of the State and the concerned local communities;
- d) promote appropriate mechanisms for a fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the use of biological resources, knowledge and technologies;
- e) ensure the effective participation of concerned communities, with a particular focus on women, in making decisions as regards the distribution of benefits which may derive from the use of their biological resources, knowledge and technologies;

dumpster. Unfortunately most of our artists do not pay attention to all these processes equally, especially audio/vocal recording.
