B.1 Launch of the Human Bondage Project (Johannesburg, South Africa, 9/05/2008)

The Human Bondage Project is a global joint venture between the South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC), UNESCO and various other international organizations and film makers. It was launched in relation with the Seminar on "Slavery, Memory and Stories: The Role and Challenge of Visual Representation"

The aim is to produce, within the next five years, a drama series, a documentary series of various lengths and feature films on slavery. A key priority for the project is that there will be stories told from an African (in its broadest sense) perspective and from the point of view of the enslaved people. The effects of slavery on modern society will also be explored.

Lancement d'un projet audio-visuel sur le servage humain (Johannesburg, Afrique du Sud, 9 mai 2008)

Le projet sur le servage humain est une activité conjointe entre la South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC), l'UNESCO et diverses autres organisations internationales et réalisateurs de films. Ce projet a été lancé en rapport avec le Séminaire sur "Esclavage, Mémoire et Histoires: rôle et défi de la représentation visuelle" organisé avec la participation d'une centaine de professionnels des médias. L'objectif est de produire au cours des cinq prochaines années une série théâtrale, une série de documentaires de durées diverses et de reportages sur l'esclavage. Le projet accorde la priorité aux histoires contées depuis une perspective africaine au sens large, et du point de vue des esclaves.

La République Démocratique du Congo est au centre des festivals culturels destinés particulièrement aux jeunes publics. Ces festivals synchronisés, la 9e Rencontre des Conteurs et Griots (RCG) et les 22ème Journées Congolaises de théâtre pour et par l'enfance et la jeunesse (JOUCOTEJ) se déroulent à Kinshasa, respectivement du 22 et du 24 mai au 31 mai 2008. This English language seminar will be organized in Accra, Ghana from 8 to 12 September 2008 by the AFRICA 2009, Programme, The Centre for Heritage Development in Africa (CHDA) and the Ghana Museums and Monuments Board (GMMB)

The seminar aims at giving an opportunity to African heritage and allied professionals to explore the relationship between the tangible and intangible aspects of sacred heritage sites in order to facilitate the development of relevant and all-inclusive approaches to their management, conservation and promotion.

The seminar programme will allow for the sharing of information, experiences and ideas on:

C.1 Burkina Faso: Politique nationale de la culture et du tourisme

Sidwaya (Ouagadougou), 23 mai 2008, par Sita Tarbagdo

(Extraits de l'article publié à l'occasion de l'atelier de validation du document de réflexion sur la politique nationale de la culture et du tourisme, convoqué par le Ministère de la Culture, du Tourisme et de la Communication (du 22 au 23 mai 2008).)

La vision de la politique nationale de la culture et du tourisme est celle d'un secteur dynamique qui joue un rôle moteur dans le développement et contribue au renforcement de la paix et à la cohésion nationale ainsi qu'au rayonnement international du Burkina Faso. Le principe-directeur en la matière est la quête permanente d'une offre culturelle et touristique de qualité, respectueuse des conventions et normes régionales et internationales, basée sur un partenariat tripartite public-privé-populations, et inscrite dans une perspective de développement humain durable et de protection de l'environnement.

Cette politique nationale de la culture et du tourisme s'exécutera à travers 4 axes stratégiques : le renforcement des capacités institutionnelles du secteur, le développement de l'économie de la culture et du tourisme, la préservation de la diversité culturelle en vue de promouvoir l'inculturation et de consolider la cohésion sociale et le soutien à la promotion extérieure des produits culturels et touristiques burkinabè.

La mise en oeuvre de cette politique qui couvre une période de 10 ans requiert une stratégie prenant en compte la programmation des actions dans le temps et dans l'espace, la mobilisation des ressources et les modalités de supervision, de suivi et d'évaluation. Cette politique sera déclinée en plans d'actions triennaux dont la mise en oeuvre se fera à travers la création de deux structures, une de coordination, le Conseil national de la culture et du tourisme et, l'autre de pilotage, le comité de pilotage. Ces deux structures travailleront en synergie et avec tous les acteurs et

partenaires du couple culture-tourisme pour faire du Burkina Faso, un pôle majeur de la culture et du tourisme en Afrique.

C.2 Cameroun: La culture urbaine en questions

Cameroon Tribune (Yaoundé), 22 mai 2008 par Eric O. Lembembe

Les professionnels de la culture ont entamé, une réflexion sur l'adoption d'une politique culturelle pour la ville de Douala.

Une rencontre de travail a été organisée la semaine dernière par l'Agence de développement de Douala (A2D) réunissant les professionnels de la culture de la ville pour mener une réflexion sur la politique culturelle de la ville visant, en aval, à déterminer les grands axes culturels de Douala et, en amont, à produire un calendrier des événements par secteurs culturels de la ville afin de former un groupe de réflexion à porter auprès des décideurs et opérateurs économiques.

Les intervenants ont considéré que l'art et la culture contribuent activement au développement du Cameroun. Ce secteur est porteur d'une nouvelle citoyenneté et mériterait qu'on lui accorde plus d'attention en créant par exemples des possibilités de financement.

En faisant l'état des lieux afin de trouver des solutions pour influencer la politique culturelle de la ville ils ont suggéré d'associer les collectivités décentralisées, intégrer plus activement les entreprises à la démarche culturelle, de susciter des intérêts divers auprès des artistes eux-mêmes et la population, de produire un document argumenté à présenter au délégué du gouvernement de Douala. Ce sont là quelques aboutissements de la rencontre qui se poursuit prochainement.

C.3 Cameroon: National Book Development Council

Since January 2008 the National Book Development Council (NBDC) has embarked on a project called “Empowering disadvantaged book sectors in Cameroon”.

The main purpose of this project is to promote a book culture among the youth with more emphasis on the girl child and to equip community and school libraries that would provide access to education and literacy to youths and girl children otherwise deprived of literary access and formal basic education.

Through this project two main activities are being carried out.

- (i) A bi-annual mobile vehicle reading campaign (*books on wheels*)
- (ii) Distribution of books to key community libraries, women Empowerment Centres, and youth centres of Cameroon.

So far the mobile library project, thanks to a vehicle provided by MIVA Switzerland, has been to more than 5 schools and 3 community libraries. NBDC is appealing for more books from Book Donors to continue this project.

This study is an important milestone for South Africa as it provides, for the first time in South Africa, quantifiable measures on the state of reading and book reading in the country and a profiling of the population in terms of demographic and psychographic analysis.

The main recommendations for further promotional efforts are as follows:

- Keep listening to your market by means of research, feedback and observation
- Increase access to books through libraries /mobile libraries
- Maintain an attractive offering – co-operate with players in the market
- Offer ranges and categories of books at different prices
- Promote the appeal factors of reading at a young age
- Think innovative book promotions and education on book offerings and choice
- Promote library membership through schools, community networks and leisure activities
- Target the Igniter segments of the population, yet, address the other segments as well
- The offerings in the market suffice for a wide range of readers' needs
- Barriers to book reading can be managed.

The 8th professional workshop for traditional and contemporary African dances «Tradition - Innovation»

This workshop has been going on at the Ecole des Sables since March 17th and will end on May 24th. 38 dancers from 21 African countries have been working in Toubab Dialaw, learning, exchanging and working to improve African

contemporary dances. They are studying with internationally recognized teachers from Africa, Europe and the US.

This eighth edition also coincides with the 10th anniversary of professional workshops at the Ecole des Sables. The first one took place on the sand of Toubab Dialaw's beaches in 1998. Since that date, the School has grown with new buildings, becoming a real dance village and hosting beautiful international meetings. About 250 dancers from 26 African countries have been trained so far in Toubab Dialaw. Dance in Africa has now its house, a powerful place, very important for meeting, learning, exchange and creation.
