On 23 July 2008, Lupwishi Mbuyamba, OCPA Executive Director was re-elected for second term of three years as chairman of the International Federation for Choral Music (IFMC) by the General Assembly of the organization held in Copenhagen on 23 July on the occasion of the 8th World Choral Symposium.

B.1 La 2e Session de la Conférence des Ministres de la Culture de l'Union Africaine

La Conférence est prévue à Alger du 19 au 23 octobre 2008. Selon l'ordre du jour provisoire, elle examinera, entre autres, les points suivants

- Le Rapport de la Commission sur la mise en oeuvre des conclusions de la Session de 2005 de la Conférence ;
- L'étude de faisabilité sur l'Institut Culturel Panafricain;
- Le projet de cadre de politique culturelle pour l'Afrique;
- Les statuts du Grand Musée Africain;
- Le projet du Festival Culturel Panafricain à Alger.

La conférence sera précédée par une **Table ronde sur les institutions culturelles africaine**. Son objectif principal est de réunir les différentes institutions culturelles africaines en vue de favoriser l'échange de vues, d'expériences et de bonnes pratiques, d'identifier les défis et les contraintes qui entravent la promotion de la culture africaine, et de développer une stratégie pour une coopération efficace, d'une part, entre les institutions culturelles en Afrique, et d'autres part, entre ces institutions et l'UA. L'OCPA a été invité par la Commission d'apporter son concours à l'organisation de la Table ronde.

Second Session of the Conference of African Union Ministers of Culture

The Conference is foreseen in Algiers from 19 to 23 October 2008. According to its provisional agenda it will discuss among others the following issues

- The AU Commission's Report on the Implementation of the outcomes of the 2005 Session of the Conference;
- The Feasibility Study on the Pan-African Cultural Institute;
- The Draft Cultural Policy Framework for Africa;
- The Statute of the Great African Museum;
- The Project on the Pan-African Cultural Festival in Algiers.

The Conference will be preceded by a **Round Table on African Cultural Institutions**. Its main objective is to bring the different cultural institutions in Africa together to: exchange views, experiences and best practices; identify challenges and constraints in promoting African culture, and develop a strategy for effective co-operation between cultural institutions on the one hand and between these institutions and the AU on the other. OCPA has been invited to assist the AU Commission in organizing the Round Table.

History that encompasses most cultural values plays an important role in continuously enriching the cultural developments, so as to remind generations about the nation's positive, cultural practices, that form the backbone of a given society. Culture in most cases is subjected to changes which changes under normal circumstances should be positive in this regard, the changes have to be portraying an attractive image to the owners of the culture, and the ones exposed to that particular culture, in this regard, it is the foreigners under the exposure of that specific culture that are being referred to.

Cultural dynamism therefore implies, the ability to do away with negative cultural practices, while positive aspects are guarded jealously. This is also a way of fostering universally acceptable cultural norms and practices ending much of the cultural conflicts.

Habineza Joseph, Minister of culture and sports declared in this respect that "Culture dynamism has always been useful in changing and admitting new and positive elements." He goes on to say, "new elements such as democracy are good as they improve on our culture."

- to encourage people or institutions who possess remarkable cultural or artistic knowledge and know-how, in order to ensure the safeguarding and transmission of this important aspect of African cultural heritage;
- to contribute in structuring the cultural and artistic life of Benin by encouraging, in the long term, the setting up of "seasons" and of an internal dissemination channel.

The first issue of the Gongs was dedicated to Beninese theatre, which acts as an incentive to the cultural and artistic life of this country.

Preservation of the Egyptian Traditional Festivals: Thanks to a grant from the European Commission, a survey of Egypt's main traditional festivals has been launched by the UNESCO's Mediterranean Programme (*Network of Traditional Festivals of the Mediterranean*) in co-operation with the NGO *Egyptian Society for Folk Traditions*.

The activity aims at recording and mapping those festivals, to promote the most interesting at the cultural tourism level, to the benefit of local communities, and to include them in the Network of Traditional Festivals of the Mediterranean.

A Festival of festivals in co-operation with the Ministry of Culture will be held in Cairo on 28-30 November 2008.

Second Phase of the Salvage of the Tomb of Amenophis III: The Royal tomb of Amenophis III, one of the greatest kings of New Kingdom Egypt, who ruled the Empire around 1500 B.C., is located on the western branch of the Valley of the Kings. The wall paintings in the tomb are a remarkable example of the Eighteenth Dynasty wall paintings in the area of Ancient Thebes and its Necropolis, which was inscribed on the World Heritage List in 1979. However, the quality of these paintings has been compromised by precarious conditions. Due to its great historical and aesthetic values, the project was chosen as the object of the prestigious funding of the Japanese Fund-in-Trust for the Preservation of the World Cultural Heritage.

Preservation of the Egyptian Traditional Storytellers' Instruments and Tools: The UNESCO Regional Office for Science in the Arab States, within the framework of the "Museum to Museum/Museum Partnership Programme", has launched in co-operation with the International Storytelling Center (Tennessee) and the International Council of Museums-Committee for Conservation-Wood, Furniture and Lacquer (ICOM-CC-Wood, Furniture and Lacquer), the first phase of a project concerning the preservation of the endangered cultural assets of the traditional Egyptian storyteller's heritage and its instruments and tools.

Street & Shadow Puppets: Within the framework of the 2003 UNESCO Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage, a project for the protection and promotion of traditional Egyptian street puppetry is currently under preparation with the NGO Egyptian Society for Folk Traditions and its affiliated puppet troupe the Wamda Group. The project aims at collecting all available information on this age-old art threatened to disappear and to train a new generation of puppet performers and puppet craftspeople in Kharazatly House.

Inauguration of the first stone of the Wadi Halfa Museum: Wadi Halfa is a town in northern Sudan. It lies on the east bank of the Nile River, 10 km. below the second cataract, just south of the Egyptian border and only 35 km. south of Abu Simbel, the most visited archaeological site in the world. It is the most important gateway between Egypt and Sudan.

On April 22, the first stone of the future Museum was laid by the Governor of Wadi Halfa. The creation of the Nubia Museum of Wadi Halfa is a major step in the co-operation between Egypt and Sudan, in the preservation and promotion of Nubia in a holistic vision.
