Y participaient des experts de 11 pays africains.L'ordre du jour comprenait les points suivants:

- -la perception par les jeunes de la musique traditionnelle

The OCPA Executive Director at the Workshop on Traditional Music (Brazzaville, Rep. of Congo, 11-12 August 2008)

Lupwishi Mbuyamba participated in the Workshop on Traditional Music in Brazzaville, République of Congo from 11 to 12 August 2008 at the initiative of the African Music Council (AMC/CAM) under the auspices of OCPA in the framework of the Festival Feux De Brazza, inaugurated by the Minister of Culture and the Arts, Mr Jean Claude Gakosso and closed by Mr Jean-Luc Aka-Evy, Director-General of the Ministry of the host country. It was attended by experts of 11 African countries. The agenda included the following points:

- -the vitality of the traditional music in the villages
- -the perception the young of the traditional music
- -the initiation to the traditional music in the school and its role in the contemporary music
- -the contribution of the media and the musical events
- -the protection and the rights of the popular creativity
- -the present situation of the research on African traditional music.

At the end of the workshop, the participants adopted a series of resolutions including research projects, publications nad the production of audio-visual goods, the introduction and promotion of the traditional music at school.

Proposals were adopted as to the research and identification of living treasures and active foyers as wel as the elaborationof a directoryof centres of excellence for research and the preservation of the African traditional music.
