


Observatory of Cultural Policies in Africa

C. 1 Up-date relating the Charter for African Cultural Renaissance

Adopted in Khartoum, The Sudan, Ethiopia, on 24 January 2006, this Charter shall come into force immediately upon receipt by the Commission of the African Union of

the instruments of ratification and adhesion from two-thirds of the total membership of the African Union (I. e. 35 Member states).

According to the list posted on the AU web site, up-dated in February 2010 (<http://www.africa-union.org/root/au/Documents/Treaties/list/Cultural%20Renaissance%20Charter.pdf>), the Charter is ratified by one country (Mali) and signed by 19 other countries (Angola, Benin, Burkina Faso, Chad, Côte d'Ivoire, Comoros, Congo, Democratic Rep. of Congo, Egypt, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Liberia, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Sao Tome & Principe, Togo and Zambia).

N.B. The Cultural Chater for Africa, adopted in 1976, came into force in 1990.

Adoptée à Khartoum, le 24 Janvier 2006, la présente Charte entrera en vigueur dès réception par la Commission de l'Union africaine des instruments de ratification et d'adhésion des deux tiers du total des membres de l'Union africaine (soit 35 Etats membres).

Selon la liste publiée sur le site web de l'UA, mis à jour en février 2010 (voir lien vers la liste au paragraphe ci-dessus, version anglaise, mise à jour en février 2010), la Charte est ratifiée par un pays (Mali) et signé par 19 autres pays (Angola, Bénin, Burkina Faso, Comores, Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Egypte, Gambie, Gabon, Ghana, Libéria, Nigeria, République Démocratique du Congo, Sénégal, Sierra Leone, Sao Tome & Principe, Tchad, Togo et Zambie).

N.B. La Charte culturelle de l'Afrique, adoptée en 1976, est entrée en vigueur en 1990.

C.2 New Programme 'Je danse donc je suis' in Ouagadougou and Bamako!

The programme "Je danse donc je suis" is an initiative of Africalia in partnership with two centers for contemporary dance, Donko Seko in Bamako and 'La Termitière'- Centre de Développement Chorégraphique in Ouagadougou. It was officially launched end January 2010 in the capital of Burkina Faso. It is financially supported by the European Commission through its programme "Investing in People" - EuropeAid.

On the agenda: a series of workshops by African dancers, awareness actions, dissemination of 'work in progress' in popular neighborhoods of Ouagadougou and

Bamako and regional exchanges between the young participants from both cities. An audiovisual follow up of this programme and actions of reflection, monitoring and evaluation will serve as measuring tools of the impact of artistic initiation on these young people.

C.4 The Place Of Cultural Diversity in the Algerian Cultural Policy

Ammar Kessab (Algeria) - In Algeria, there no explicit cultural policy in the field of cultural diversity. So, this work is based on the historical references about culture and diversity in Algeria to draw the policy of the State.

In North Africa in general and Algeria particularly, cultural diversity is certainly important but it does not have the same proportions as in other African regions.

After the independence in 1962, the cultural policy in Algeria was based on a purely Arabic-Islamic definition that has denied any aspects of cultural diversity.

The people demanding acknowledgement of their Amazigh identity managed to make their voices heard in 1962 but only partially.

On its part, the state, via the Ministry of Culture, organizes a number of events that show various aspects of the components of Algeria's identity.

Algeria was the first country to ratify the UNESCO Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage (2003). It has been used as a basis for the Algerian

Declaration on Cultural Diversity and the Preservation of the People's Identities and Heritage, which was adopted during the Islamic Conference of Ministers of Culture in December 2004.

On 1 April 2010, Botswana deposited with the Director-General its instrument of acceptance of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage. In accordance with the terms of its Article 34, the aforementioned Convention will enter into force with respect to Botswana three months after the date of the deposit of its instrument, that is to say on 1 July 2010.

As a specialist in architecture and urban planning, Mr Bandarin previously worked in both public and private institutions in the fields of built heritage, cultural heritage conservation, environmental heritage and

cultural events. As Director of the WHC, Mr Bandarin has led the development of a vast network of public private partnerships for World Heritage conservation.

The new Assistant Director-General for UNESCO's Africa Department will be Lalla Aïcha Ben Barka of Mali, who is currently the Deputy Executive Secretary of the United Nations' Economic Commission for Africa. Ms Ben Barka was Director of UNESCO's Regional Bureau for Education in Africa, from 2004-2007.
