C. News about cultural policies, institutions and resources in Africa

C.1 The 1st Conference on Cultural Policies in the Arab Region - Recommendations

The organizers and participants of the conference agree to the following recommendations:

First: Debate and Discussion

1- Organize seminars and discussions on specific elements of cultural policy with governmental players, especially ministries of culture, and international donors and organizations in the Arab region for preparing a regional conference on cultural policies in 2012.

2- Exchanging experiences in cultural policy research, documentation and reform with Turkey, Balkan countries and Sub-Saharan Africa. This would include organizing joint activities and encounters and inviting independent and governmental experts from these regions to contribute to cultural policy survey and evaluation in the Arab region.

Second: Research

1- To refine, complete and publish the full results of the research that came out of the 1st phase of the project online. This should be done before the end of 2010.

2- Start, early 2011, a 2nd phase of research that includes up to 4 new countries in the Arab region. This should be preceded by an evaluation of how the Compendium model worked and what needs to be modified to suit the region.

3- Launch cultural policy focus groups consisting of independent and governmental experts in the 8 countries to monitor and document trends, good practices and developments. The focus groups should start to work in September 2010 and their feedback will constitute an important reference for all cultural policy discussions and debates in the region.

Third: Dissemination of Information on Cultural Policy

- 1- Prepare and publish a bi-monthly update of cultural policies in the 8 countries. The first newsletter should be published in November 2010. The content will be based on feedback by the focus groups.
- 2- Prepare and publish an annual cultural action report that is based on the bi-monthly update. The first report should be published by the end of 2011.
- 3- Explore the creation of a “cultural action index” for evaluating cultural action in the 8 countries. The definition of index criteria should be developed during the discussion with governmental, independent and international players in the course of 2010 and 2011, and based on the content of the bi-monthly update and the annual report. A pilot index for the 8 countries will be presented in the conference in 2012, with the ambition that it will be used by other countries.

Fourth: General Recommendations

- 1- Build alliances with the sectors that can play an active role in implementing these recommendations, especially the media and educational sectors.
- 2- Considering all participants in the conference as potential partners in the implementation of these recommendations.

C.2 Nigeria Revue in the culture house - Hope rises for new culture policy

By Sola Balogun, Thursday, May 27, 2010 - It's true many practitioners in the culture sector yearn for more actions, particularly on the part of government. It is also true that only government cannot make the actions possible, as a union of both the private and public sectors can stimulate cultural development in the country.

This is probably why the new Minister of Tourism, Culture and National Orientation, Alhaji Abubakar Sadiq Mohammed, called on stakeholders in the culture community to meet on June 15 for a review of the Culture Policy. Although launched about 22 years ago by Babangida regime, the Cultural Policy has only been implemented in parts.

In 2004, the policy was jointly reviewed by the then Federal Ministry of Tourism and Culture and UNESCO. After the week-long review, the draft of the new policy was forwarded to the Federal Executive Council which unfortunately has kept it till date.

But in the wisdom of the new minister, the will be policy will reexamined after the proposed stakeholders' meeting before ratification for implementation.

C.3 Les Ministres du Maghreb annoncent un calendrier culturel régional

Par Jamel Arfaoui pour Magharebia à Tunis – 03/06/10 - Les Ministres de la culture du Maghreb se sont rencontrés en Libye pour programmer des festivals fêtant le patrimoine et des forums sur les Beaux-Arts, avec pour objectif d'approfondir les liens régionaux.

Les Ministres de la Culture du Maghreb ont annoncé, dimanche 30 mai à Tripoli, la tenue d'une série de festivals et d'événements culturels, avec pour objectif de renforcer la coopération dans la région.

"Nous voulons construire une union basée sur quelque chose de fondamental, qui est la culture, basée aussi sur d'autres formes de coopération et de solidarité aux niveaux social, économique et financier", a déclaré Bensalem Himmich, Ministre marocain de la Culture.

"Nous partageons la culture, la religion et la civilisation, et la [culture] est un élément qui renforce les liens d'interdépendance parmi les populations du Maghreb", a dit Habib Ben Yahia, Secrétaire-Général de l'Union du Maghreb.

Selon le communiqué émis lors de la clôture de la Conférence, la Libye va accueillir un festival de poésie andalouse et un Sommet sur le rôle de la culture dans la protection de la jeunesse face à l'isolement culturel. Le pays hébergera également une conférence sur le marché du film au Maghreb et un festival célébrant la liberté dans la littérature féminine.

L'Algérie organisera des festivals, l'un consacré au film maghrébin, l'autre à la musique andalouse et inchad (musique religieuse). Le pays accueillera également deux forums sur les droits d'auteur et sur la coopération dans la lutte contre les trafics illégaux portant sur la propriété intellectuelle, ainsi qu'un salon culturel régional pour les écrivains.

Pendant ce temps, la Mauritanie hébergera une conférence sur l'écriture et la préservation de la musique, un festival de poésie du Maghreb, une exposition littéraire régionale, un Sommet sur le thème du roman maghrébin, un festival de chansons du Maghreb et une exposition consacrée aux Beaux-Arts. Le Maroc, à son tour, organisera le Forum du Maghreb pour l'Héritage Musical Commun, une conférence sur les pierres sculptées et une soirée consacrée à l'art du conte maghrébin. La Tunisie, enfin, accueillera un forum sur le patrimoine et un Sommet sur la protection du savoir traditionnel culturel non-matériel.

Le Conseil a désigné Nouakchott et Tlemcen capitales de la culture islamique en 2011, et il a institué un prix attribué à la traduction d'ouvrages intellectuels maghrébins dans d'autres langues.

Maghreb Ministers announce regional cultural calendar

By Jamel Arfaoui for Magharebia in Tunis – 03/06/10 - Maghreb culture ministers met in Libya to schedule heritage festivals and fine arts forums to deepen regional ties.

Maghreb culture ministers announced on Sunday (May 30th) in Tripoli a series of festivals and cultural events to strengthen Maghreb co-operation.

"We want to build a union based on something fundamental, which is culture", said Moroccan Culture Minister Bensalem Himmich.

"We share culture, religion and civilisation, and [culture] is an element that strengthens ties of interdependence among the peoples of the Maghreb," Arab Maghreb Union secretary-general Habib Ben Yahia said.

According to the closing statement, Libya will host a festival of Andalusian poetry and a symposium on culture's role in protecting youth from cultural alienation. Libya will also host a symposium on the Maghreb film market and a festival celebrating freedom in women's literature.

Algeria will host festivals of Maghreb film, Andalusian music and inshad (religious chanting). Algeria will also welcome two forums on author's rights and co-operation in fighting illicit traffic of cultural property, as well as a Maghreb cultural salon for writers. Meanwhile, Mauritania will host a symposium on writing and preserving music, a Maghreb poetry festival, a Maghreb book exposition, a symposium on the Maghreb novel, a Maghreb song festival and a Maghreb fine arts exposition. Morocco, in turn, will organise the Maghreb Forum for Common Music Heritage, a symposium on the heritage of stone carvings and a Maghreb storytelling evening. Tunisia will host a heritage forum and a symposium on protecting cultural and non-material traditional knowledge.

The council named Nouakchott and Tlemcen as capitals of Islamic culture for 2011, and instituted an award for the translation of Maghreb intellectual works into other languages.

The Fund is a unique organisation working within the Zimbabwean society during a defining moment in the history of the country, one that stakeholders in the sector lobbied for since the 1990s. It is a non-partisan civil society organisation established and registered as a Trust in June 2006 as a result of the Swedish International Development Agency (Sida) and stakeholders' desire to address inconsistent funding of the Culture Sector in Zimbabwe. Registered with the National Arts Council of Zimbabwe, the Culture Fund envisions a dynamic, diversified and sustainable culture sector imbued with Zimbabwean values and identity, which contributes towards wealth creation.

Tasked with the mission to contribute to the growth and development of the culture sector in Zimbabwe by providing finance and technical support to cultural practitioners, institutions and activities in the various artistic disciplines for individuals, clubs, cooperatives, companies and partnerships, trusts and foundations, associations and institutions:

C.5 Acte SEPT (Mali)

Née à Bamako en 1994, Acte SEPT est une association ayant pour but de contribuer à la promotion de la culture malienne et de favoriser l'épanouissement de ses membres à travers des activités artistiques et culturelles.

The “Girona Statement”

Following the Brussels Symposium on “Culture as a Vector of Development” in April 2009, the European Commission organised an international seminar on culture and development in Girona, Spain from 4-6 May 2010. As a follow-up to the meetings in April and December 2009 organised by the European Commission on the theme of “Culture and Development”, the British Council convened a meeting in Brussels in March this year attended by 17 cultural agencies, mainly based in Europe but working in Africa, to share information and to discuss ways in which they might collaborate in the future. The group identified four key areas to focus on together:

- Mapping the cultural industries – to provide essential data to cultural policy-makers on all aspects of the creative sector across Africa.
- Festivals – an opportunity for intercultural dialogue between north and south, a space for exchange and dialogue, and for greater traffic between European and African artists and their audiences. Working in support of festivals also provides new opportunities for working effectively in conflict and post-conflict societies.
- Training and Development – developing new models to share learning and information between individuals and institutions; strengthening cultural institutions across Africa.
- Policy Development – a means of ensuring the long-term sustainability of cultural institutions across Africa.

In association with the Bushfire Festival (28-30 May), the Swaziland National Arts Council and the Commonwealth Foundation, Arterial Network organised a one-day seminar on cultural policy in Swaziland on 27 May.

The well-attended event included a presentation by Avril Joffe on the proposed cultural policy framework being developed for African countries from a civil society perspective and a perspective on the cultural policy development process in Zimbabwe provided by Farai Mpfunya, director of the Culture Fund and a member of the Arterial Network Cultural Policy Task Group.

Dr. Gumbi who led Swaziland's recent cultural policy formulation process, also presented an outline of that process. The proposed cultural policy is now with the Cabinet and it was stressed that having a cultural policy was only the beginning of securing a constructive environment for national artistic practice. It was crucial for civil society organisations to monitor and to help manage the implementation of cultural policy.

La «Déclaration de Girona»

Après le colloque de Bruxelles sur le thème "La culture comme vecteur de développement" en avril 2009, la Commission européenne a organisé un séminaire international sur la culture et le développement à Girona, en Espagne du 4 au 6 mai 2010.

En tant que suivi aux réunions en avril et en Décembre 2009 organisée par la Commission européenne sur le thème de «Culture et Développement», le British Council a organisé une réunion à Bruxelles en mars de cette année avec la participation de 17 organismes culturels, principalement basés en Europe mais travaillant en Afrique, pour partager leurs informations et discuter de quelles manières ils pourraient collaborer à l'avenir. À la fin de la première réunion, le groupe a identifié quatre domaines clés sur lesquels il faudra se concentrer:

- Cartographie les industries culturelles - Fournir des données essentielles pour les décideurs politiques culturelles sur tous les aspects du secteur de la création à travers l'Afrique.
- Festivals - une opportunité pour le dialogue interculturel entre le nord et le sud, un espace d'échange et de dialogue, et pour plus de communication entre artistes européens, africains et leurs publics. Travailler en appui des festivals crée également des nouvelles possibilités pour travailler efficacement dans les sociétés en conflits et les sociétés post-conflit.
- Formation et développement - le développement de nouveaux modèles pour échanger connaissances et informations entre les individus et les institutions, renforcer les institutions culturelles à travers l'Afrique.
- Politique de développement - un moyen d'assurer la viabilité à long terme des institutions culturelles à travers l'Afrique.

L'événement incluait une présentation par Avril Joffe sur le cadre de la politique culturelle en cours d'élaboration pour les pays africains du point de vue de la société civile et une perspective sur le processus d'élaboration des politiques culturelles au Zimbabwe fournies par Farai Mpfunya, directeur du Fonds de culture et membre du Groupe de travail politique culturelle du réseau Arterial

Dr Gumbi qui a récemment mené le processus de formulation des politiques culturelles au Swaziland, a également présenté un aperçu de ce processus. La

politique culturelle proposé se trouve désormais dans les mains du Cabinet qui sait que la politique culturelle n'est qu'un début dans l'assurance d'un environnement constructif pour la pratique artistique national.
