

The 3rd World Festival of Negro Arts in Dakar (Senegal, 10-31 December 2010)

The third edition of World Negro Arts Festival opened in Dakar, Senegal Friday, 44 years after it hosted the first one. The event will run till end of December 2010.

Over 2,000 artists from about 53 countries and representing all disciplines as well as a couple of heads of state, have already arrived in the country to take part in the festival.

The official opening will take place at the luxurious beach side and ocean-view hotel near Dakar and another ceremony at the Douta Seck cultural foundation. The open air fanfare and ballet show will feature in the evening at the Leopold Sedar Senghor soccer stadium in Dakar.

The festival is hosted by the African Union and the Senegalese Government and sponsored by partners including the Francophonie International Organisation. More at

Le troisième Festival mondial des Arts nègres bat son plein à Dakar

11 Décembre 2010 - L'ouverture a été donnée, vendredi soir, au stade Léopold Sédar Senghor par un spectacle grandiose alliant une chorégraphie qui a retracé le passé de l'Afrique et dessiné son avenir. En présence de quatre chefs d'Etat africains et un public venu nombreux.

Le troisième Festival mondial des arts nègres a démarré, hier, en apothéose. Le Sénégal a mis les moyens pour une belle entrée en matière. Devant ses homologues de la Guinée Equatoriale, de la Guinée-Bissau et de la Mauritanie, le président Abdoulaye Wade a lancé les festivités. Un feu d'artifice grandiose a donné le ton.

Les 1300 danseurs ivoiriens, guinéens, maliens, sénégalais, etc., font leur apparition sous la musique du Jamaïcain, Paul G. Réil et le rythme de la Kora de Noumoucounda Cissokho, frère de Baboula Cissokho. Un mélange de tam-tam et de musique occidentale.

La fête ne faisait que commencer. Des chanteurs africains de renom se sont ensuite succédé sur la pelouse du stade Léopold Sédar Senghor qui ont tenu à marquer l'ouverture de ce troisième Festival mondial des arts nègres qui prendra fin le 31 décembre prochain.

A. News from OCPA / Les nouvelles de l'OCPA

A.1 Consultations in view of the Feasibility Study on the Establishment of the Pan African Cultural Institute

In the process of the implementation of the Feasibility Study on the Establishment of the Pan African Cultural Institute, in October OCPA participated in the inquiry by questionnaire related to this project carried out by the Centre for Heritage Development in Africa (CHDA, Mombasa).

More recently, on the 1st of December, it received the visit of Mr Peter Okwaro, Coordinator Movable Heritage, who arrived to Mozambique for deepening the consultation with selected partners.

In this framework Mr Peter Okwaro discussed the project with the OCPA Executive Director who gave him a detailed presentation of OCPA's objectives, programmes and achievements and provided him with a set of documents about OCPA's statutes and assets, as well as its structures and networks of partners (institutions, specialists, international, regional, sub-regional and national focal points).

A.2 Angeline Kamba Doctor Honoris Causa

On 3 December 2010 the Midlands State University in Gweru, (Zimbabwe) awarded Angeline Kamba, member of the OCPA Steering Committee the title of Doctor honoris causa of Arts in Archaeology, Museum Studies and Cultural Heritage.

A.3 The Executive Director Receives the PASMAE Award

On the 7th of December on the occasion of the 1st PASMAE West Africa Conference 2010, held in Winneba, Ghana a ceremony took place in University of Education of Winneba (Ghana) in the framework of which Lupwishi Mbuyamba, the OCPA Executive Director was given the First Award of Excellence of the Pan African Society of Music Arts Education for his distinguished contribution to the growth and development of music education in Africa and the World.

In his absence the Award was handed over by the Chair of PASMAE, Prof. Tunde Babawale, the Director General of CBAAC to Mr Carl Ampah, Executive Officer representing the Directory of the UNESCO Accra Office.

A.4 Meeting with the Deputy National Director of Culture of Mozambique

On 8 December the Executive Director had a meeting with Dr Solange Macamo, Deputy National Director of Culture of Mozambique on new heritage sites to be rehabilitated in the framework of the Culture Emergency programme of the Prince Claus Fund and on the preparation of a workshop foreseen in Maputo in 2011 on establishing in Mozambique of a heritage conservation training programme for Portuguese speaking African countries similar to the Ecole du patrimoine africain (PortoNovo) and the Centre for Heritage Development in Africa (CHDA, Mombasa), project for which OCPA's technical support is requested.

A.5 Interview given to the Radio France Culture

On 9 December the Executive Director gave an interview to Radio France Culture on the occasion of the 3rd World Festival of Negro Arts (Dakar, 10-31 December 2010) and on the relevance of cultural policies in Africa.

A.6 The Executive Director at the ACALAN Workshop with regional language and cultural centres: Identifying common ground and strategies (Zanzibar, 15 – 16 December 2010)

In this workshop organized by ACALAN, representatives of ACALAN, CELHTO-UA, CERDOTOLA, CICIBA, EACROTANAL, East African Community (EAC), LASU and OCPA exchanged experience and discussed possible joint strategies for co-ordinated action.

OCPA was represented by the Executive Director, Lupwishi Mbuyamba.

C.2 Ratification by Eritrea of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage

On 7 October 2010, Eritrea deposited with the Director-General its instrument of ratification of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage.

In accordance with the terms of its Article 34, the aforementioned Convention will enter into force with respect to Eritrea three months after the date of the deposit of this instrument, that is to say on 7 January 2011.

Thus presently the African State Parties of this convention are (31 countries): Algeria, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Central African Republic, Chad, Côte d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gabon, Guinea, Kenya, Lesotho, Madagascar, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Morocco, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Seychelles, Sudan, Togo, Tunisia, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe. Le 7 octobre 2010, l'Erythrée a déposé auprès de la Directrice générale son instrument de ratification de la Convention pour la sauvegarde du patrimoine culturel immatériel.

D. News, institutions, resources and events in other regions and countries

D.1 Conférence des Ministres de la Culture de l'Union Européenne – Plan de travail pour 2011 - 2014

Au cours de leur récente réunion (réunion n° 3046, 18 - 19 novembre 2010), les ministres de la Culture des Etats membres de l'UE ont adopté un plan de travail de quatre ans pour la culture. Certains des travaux prévus prendront la forme de réunions d'experts qui sont délégués par les ministres de la culture, pour discuter de sujets importants.

Certaines tâches sont adressées à la Commission. Ceux-ci incluent des études sur l'effet des films à sous-titrage, sur l'appréciation sur l'art et l'éducation aux médias, et des propositions pour établir une alliance avec le secteur des entreprises des industries créatives et pour créer des conseils dans le secteur de la culture, des organismes qui regroupent les employeurs, les syndicats et autres parties prenantes.

Le plan de travail pour la culture a adopté pour 2011-2014 porte sur les priorités suivantes:

- la diversité culturelle, dialogue interculturel et la culture accessibles et inclusifs;
- industries culturelles et créatives;
- les compétences et la mobilité;
- le patrimoine culturel, y compris la mobilité des collections;
- la culture dans les relations extérieures;
- statistiques culturelles.

Ces priorités seront mises en œuvre à travers la méthode ouverte de coordination (groupes de travail avec des experts des Etats membres) et un dialogue renforcé avec la société civile.

Le Conseil a adopté des conclusions sur le rôle de la culture dans la lutte contre la pauvreté et l'exclusion sociale, voir 15448/10. Les conclusions font valoir qu'il est important pour une dimension culturelle doit être intégrée dans les politiques contre

la pauvreté et l'exclusion sociale. Participation à la vie culturelle et l'éducation artistique peut jouer un rôle important dans la lutte contre la pauvreté en encourageant l'inclusion sociale des groupes sociaux vulnérables et promouvoir la diversité culturelle et le dialogue interculturel.

EU Conference of Ministers of Culture – Work Plan for 2011 - 2014

During their recent meeting (Meeting No 3046, 18 – 19 November 2010) culture ministers of EU member states agreed on a four-year work plan for culture. Some of the planned work will take the form of meetings of experts who are delegated by the culture ministers, to discuss fairly obvious and sensible topics.

Some tasks are addressed to the Commission. Those include studies on the effect of subtitling films, on art valuation and on media literacy and proposals for establishing alliance with the enterprise sector on creative industries and culture sector councils, bodies that include employers, trade unions and other stakeholders.

The Work plan for culture adopted for 2011-2014 addresses the following priorities:

- cultural diversity, intercultural dialogue and accessible and inclusive culture;
- cultural and creative industries;
- skills and mobility;
- cultural heritage, including mobility of collections;
- culture in external relations;
- culture statistics.

These priorities will be implemented through the open method of coordination (working groups with member states' experts) and a reinforced dialogue with civil society.

The Council adopted conclusions on the role of culture in combating poverty and social exclusion, see 15448/10. The conclusions argue that it is important for a cultural dimension to be incorporated into policies against poverty and social exclusion. Participation in cultural life and arts education can play a significant role in the fight against poverty by encouraging social inclusion of vulnerable social groups and promotion cultural diversité and inter-cultural dialogue.

D.2 Culture place at the hart of Afro-Européen dialogue

Sinc the end of the 1990s, the Européen Union has been progressive more commette to strengthening dialogue and building more specific and special relations with Africa. The first EU-Africa summit was held in Cairo in April 2000. The second summit took place in Lisbon in 2007. This summit further strengthened the partnership and brought the EU-Africa dialogue to higher political level.

The Treaty of Lisbon signed at this summit placed the emphasis, for the first time, on culture and creation, by according it a central role in all European political fields

that include regional policy and foreign affairs and development. Culture must therefore find a place “at the heart” of development policies. At Lisbon, the frequency of the summits was also determined. From now on, they will take place every three years. The next one will be held on Syrte/Tripoli, Libya, on November 29th 2010.

The theory was quickly put into practice. The European Commission has increased its efforts to show that culture is a factor of human development, social cohesion and employment. It was thus under the driving force of Louis Michel, the then European Organiser in charge of development and humanitarian aid that in April 2009, the colloquium “Culture and Creation: Factors in Development” was organised.

Commissioner Piebalgs co-chaired a high-level round table on the subject of “Culture and Development” as part of the United Nations summit on Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). Culture is increasingly recognised as a fundamental dimension in building development and in constructive relations between people. The European Union-Africa partnership has also identified cultural co-operation as one of the priority actions to consolidate this important dialogue between the two continents. One of these actions which form part of the campaign launched by the African Union for the period 2010 to 2012 “African Cultural Renaissance”.

La culture placée au cœur du dialogue Afrique-Europe

Depuis la fin des années 90, l’Union européenne s’est progressivement attelée à renforcer le dialogue et à nouer une relation plus spécifique et privilégiée avec l’Afrique. Le premier Sommet UE-Afrique, s’est tenu au Caire en avril 2000. Le second Sommet a eu lieu à Lisbonne en 2007. Ce Sommet a renforcé davantage le partenariat et a introduit le dialogue UE-Afrique au plus haut niveau politique.

De surcroît, le Traité de Lisbonne signé à l’issue de ce Sommet a mis l’accent, pour la première fois, sur la culture et la création, en lui accordant un rôle central explicite dans tous les domaines politiques européens qui englobent la politique régionale et les affaires étrangères jusqu’au développement. La culture doit ainsi trouver sa place «au cœur» des politiques de développement. A Lisbonne on a également déterminé la fréquence des Sommets. Ils se dérouleront désormais tous les trois ans. Le prochain aura lieu à Syrte/Tripoli, en Libye, le 29 novembre 2010.

La théorie fut rapidement mise en pratique. La Commission Européenne a renforcé ces efforts pour démontrer que la culture est un facteur de développement humain, de cohésion sociale et d’emploi. C’est donc sous l’impulsion de Louis Michel, alors Commissaire européen en charge du développement et de l’aide humanitaire, qu’en avril 2009, le colloque «Culture et création: facteurs de développement» fut organisé.

A cette occasion, Louis Michel a insisté sur l’importance de s’adresser à un public large puisque la culture n’est pas «un jouet plaisant pour des élites prétentieuses» mais une partie intégrante du développement, «une sphère dans laquelle la société

exprime son rapport au monde, et projette son avenir, d'une certaine manière un ciment mental de la cohésion sociale».

Le Partenariat Union Européenne-Afrique a aussi identifié la Coopération culturelle comme une des actions prioritaires pour consolider cet important dialogue entre les deux continents. Une des actions qui s'inscrivent dans la Campagne lancée par l'Union Africaine pour la période 2010-2012 "Renaissance Culturelle Africaine" et soutenue par la Commission Européenne est justement la réalisation et la circulation de l'exposition itinérant de pratiques artistiques africaines "Visionary Africa: Art at Work".

The ICC also represents a significant portfolio of arts and cultural research and academic centres of excellence within the city, including Liverpool School of Art and Design at LJMU and the Schools of Architecture, English and Music at the University of Liverpool.

Formally launched in November 2010, the ICC team has been busy promoting the Institute across European networks, including the International Conference on Cultural Policy Research in Jyvaskyla, Finland; the HerO conference (Heritage as Opportunity, part of the EU's Urbact programme) in Lublin, Poland; and the After the Cultural City conference in Pécs, Hungary.

Even if it is intellectually justifiable to read Nollywood side by side other cinematic practices such as Hollywood and Bollywood, can such pairing bring out what Nollywood really represents to those for whom the films are made? Is it possible to read Nollywood outside the framework of popular culture? As popular culture, what critical category do we need to read it as an urban African art?

First Arterial Network General Council hosted in Morocco

The first General Council of Arterial Network comprising elected country representatives from sixteen national chapters, Steering Committee members and interim country representatives from a further ten countries met in Casablanca, Morocco from 30 Nov-1 December. Also attended by core Arterial funding partners, the meeting was highly successful with delegates sharing experiences and learnings, adopting a full Constitution as well as other policies to guide the future development of Arterial Network. The General Council also coincided with the official launch of the Moroccan chapter, bringing the regional subtotals of national chapters to 3 in North Africa, 5 in West Africa, 2 in Central Africa, 2 in East Africa and 4 in Southern Africa.

Steering Committee

After the General Council, the Steering Committee had a short meeting to tie up loose ends arising out of the General Council. Patrick Mudekereza of the DRC was elected to the Executive Committee.

EU Development Days

Africalia – one of the core funding partners of Arterial Network – hosted a stall at the EU's Development Days in Brussels on 6-7 December and provided an opportunity for Arterial Network to talk about its work on the African continent. Africalia also hosted a meeting of Arterial's core funding partners at which research commissioned by Hivos into the first three years of Arterial Network served as the basis for an excellent discussion about the challenges and possibilities facing the Network. The meeting was attended by Hivos, Arterial Network, Stichting DOEN and the Swedish Institute.

"The economic slide has led to fewer U.S. companies making philanthropic contributions to the arts, although companies that continued their support are giving a slightly bigger share of their charitable dollars to the arts, a new survey says. Overall, support for the arts from small and mid-size businesses grew, while arts giving fell from large businesses, says the Triennial Survey of Business Support for the Arts report from The Business Committee for the Arts, a division of Americans for the Arts. The number of businesses providing charitable support for the arts fell to 28 percent in 2009 from 43 percent in 2006, while the share of 600 businesses surveyed that gave to any charitable cause fell to 52 percent from 70 percent."
