B.1 Call for applications – Visiting Artists Residency at Greatmore Studios, September – November 2011

The aim of the Visiting Artists Residency is to facilitate cultural exchange and creative dialogue by bringing together international and local artists in a stimulating and supportive environment. In this milieu, artists have formed strong professional bonds and lifelong friendships.

Four studios are allocated for visiting artists. Twelve visiting residencies are available each year, with four visiting artists participating at any one time. The duration of the residency is for 3 months.

Visiting artists are obliged to interact with the permanent residents, give a presentation of their work, participate in the outreach programme and exhibit their work at the end of their stay. The visiting residency includes accommodation, studio space, per diems, outreach and materials budget plus an exhibition in Greatmore's Gallery space at the conclusion of the residency.

C.1 Souht Africa (DAC Newsletter): Charter to Raise Cultural Awareness

Culture is regarded as an essential element of any society’s identity; hence it is central to any country’s development.

The Department of Arts and Culture will host a workshop to discuss the Charter for African Cultural Renaissance. The Charter plays a significant role in preserving and celebrating history on the continent as well as directing the future which will be characterised by shared values of the African Union which stresses unity, peace and prosperity on the continent.

To take advantage of the above initiative and further improve on service delivery in the arts and culture sector, the Department of Arts and Culture is planning a broad consultation with stakeholders in the sector in the form of workshops aimed at advocating national buy-in for South Africa becoming a state party to the Charter for African Cultural Renaissance. The Charter provides that any African cultural

policy should enable the people to preserve their cultural heritage and identity as a significant factor for development.

C.2 South Africa: Budget Vote to Mainstream Arts in the Economy

DAC Newsletter, June 2011 - The Department of Arts and Culture is bristling with confidence as it prepares for its Budget Vote in Parliament. The Budget Vote took place soon after a successful National Consultative Conference on the Role of the Arts, Culture & Heritage Sector in the Economy which took place in Newtown, Johannesburg on 14 – 15 April.

It brought together hundreds of delegates to an event that is viewed as marking a turning point in how the sector is perceived. Importantly, it has placed arts, culture and heritage in the mainstream of the economy.

Over the last few months, The Minister of Culture, Mashatile and Deputy Minister Joe Phaahla have embarked on a consultative process and strategic planning sessions with senior management and other officials in the sector.

Ever since he took over as the new minister, Mashatile has emphasised the central role of arts and culture and its role in economic growth and development: “There is an urgent need for the sector, especially government, to realise that the arts make a significant contribution to the economic development of a people. It creates jobs, fights poverty and provides platforms for economic self-reliance. Thus the arts must be prioritised to be in the forefront of economic development,” said Mashatile.

C.3 World Heritage in Africa Region

This UNESCO brochure presents the principal results of the Second Cycle of Periodic Reporting in the Africa region. The exercise involved the 44 States Parties which had ratified the 1972 Convention Concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage and the 78 World Heritage properties inscribed on the World Heritage List in January 2010.

There have been several successes in the region since the World Heritage Committee adopted the report of the First Cycle of Periodic Reporting in the Africa region in 2002. Since then, a further eight States Parties have ratified the Convention, four properties have been removed from the List of World Heritage in

Danger, all properties have Statements of Outstanding Universal Value and 21 new properties have been inscribed on the World Heritage. However, the Africa region remains under-represented on the World Heritage List as less than nine percent of all World Heritage properties are located in this region.

La région Afrique, où sont recensés moins de 9 % de la totalité des biens du patrimoine mondial, demeure cependant sous-représentée sur la Liste du patrimoine mondial.

The International Network for Contemporary Performing Arts (IETM) and the Korea Arts Management Service (KAMS) just published a new manual for cultural operators and artists interested in cooperative ventures in Asia, in Europe, and between Asia and Europe.

The Manual consists of four main chapters:

"Introduction—Methodology" underscores the importance of identifying common ground between people of different cultures. "The Manual" systematically describes the trends and methods of co-production. The chapter "Case Studies" presents 15 different categories of co-production experiences and types such as Asia-Asia, Asia-Europe, and Europe-Europe projects. "Research Resources" the final section of the Manual, defines various terms that are used differently by different producers and lists additional Asian and European cases. There are also a checklist and resource references for preparing international tours.

D.4 New inscriptions recommended for UNESCO's Memory of the World Register

Posted on June 23, 2011 - The Director-General of UNESCO, Irina Bokova has endorsed recommendations by the International Advisory Committee of the Memory of the World Committee to inscribe 45 new documents and documentary collections from all over the world on the Memory of the World Register, which now numbers a total of 238 items.

The Memory of the World Register covers all types of material and support, including stone, celluloid, parchment, audio recordings and more.

The new items include two Africa related documentary collections from

- Morocco: Kitab al-ibar, wa diwan al-mobtadae wa al-khabar (a pioneering work in sociology or treaty of political philosophy by Ibn Khaldun).
- Tunisia: Privateering and the international relations of the Regency of Tunis in the 18th and 19th centuries

UNESCO launched the Memory of the World Programme in 1992 to guard against collective amnesia by through the preservation of the valuable archive holdings and library collections all over the world and ensuring their wide dissemination.

N.B. It seems that this program has not attracted the attention of African countries. Of the 238 document collections recorded on this list, there are only eight collections of six African countries: Egypt (3), Ghana, Madagascar, Mauritius, Morocco and Tunisia. In addition, there are only eight countries that have a Coordinating Committee for the Memory of the World (South Africa, Malawi, Mauritania, Nigeria, Senegal, Rep.of Central Africa, DR of. Congo and Tanzania).

Federal Labor Statistics: Arts Jobs Predicted to Grow at Eleven Percent - Miller-McCune

"Using data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the National Endowment for the Arts projects a growth rate of 11 percent for arts-related occupations over the next seven years. Perhaps surprisingly, that's a bit higher than the projected increase of 10 percent for the overall labor force. Granted, the figure is lower than many other fields in the 'professional and related occupations' category, such as the 72 percent projected increase in jobs for biomedical engineers. Nevertheless, the need for qualified professionals in many arts-related occupations is expected to grow as fast, or faster, than the job market as a whole through the year 2018." <http://bit.ly/qHs6tO>

It was welcomed and appreciated, except that speakers from Eastern Europe felt the need to complement its chapter on facilities with cultural houses.
