

B.5 The 5th edition of the “East Africa Art Biennale – EASTAFAB 2011”

For the first time since its inception back in 2002, the Organising Committee will move the biennale 2011 across East Africa. Starting in Dar-es-Salaam (Tanzania) in November 2011, it will be held in

- Arusha (East Africa Community Headquarters, Tanzania) in January 2012
- Nairobi (Kenya) in February 2012
- Kampala (Uganda) in March 2012
- Kigali (Rwanda) in April 2012 and
- Bujumbura (Burundi) in May 2012.

Achieving this will make the East Africa Art Biennale the only travelling biennale in the World; moreover, exposure of the East African artists' productions and media coverage in the East Africa Community will magnify considerably the regional and international promotional impact of the biennale and in the process it will celebrate the genuine contemporary art & culture of this unified region of Africa.

In each location, the biennale organizers, the participating local artists and the local committees will work together to booster the cultural life with art exhibitions and performances, conferences, workshops and meetings around the theme: "One people, One destiny".

The East Africa Art Biennale association is a non-profit NGO registered since January 2003 with the Tanzanian National Council of Arts (BASATA Serial No 1950) and depending solely on grants, donations and sponsorships for funds or for services from national and international organisations and companies.

Its objectives are

- To promote the culture and the contemporary visual and performing arts of East Africa, as well as improving the skills, careers, living and working conditions of the artists of this region".
- To professionally organise every two years a grand exhibition presenting the best recent works of the East African artists together with few other international guest artists.

C.1 Ratification by Morocco of the Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage (Paris, 2 November 2001)

On 20 June 2011, Morocco deposited with the Director-General its instrument of ratification of the Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage.

In accordance with the terms of its Article 27, the aforementioned Convention will enter into force with respect to Morocco three months after the date of the deposit of this instrument, that is to say on 20 September 2011.

- facilitating continuing education through professional attachments, study visits, seminars and workshops; and
- providing technical and financial assistance to members whenever possible.
- promoting the implementation of the professional code of conduct (code of ethics).

The 2011 ESARBICA-NAZ Audiovisual Training Workshop will take place from August 1 to August 12, 2011, and will be hosted and organized by the National Archives of Zimbabwe in collaboration with ESARBICA. The course will be held on the premises of the NAZ and the Zimbabwe Broadcasting Holdings facilities. The training was made possible with the assistance of ESARBICA and the Fund for

D.1 Guidance on the development of legislation and administration systems in the field of cultural heritage (10/05/2011)

What laws should states enact to protect and promote their cultural heritage, and what administrative systems can they put in place to manage their cultural heritage policies most effectively? This revised and expanded guidance document aims to provide authoritative information on good practice in three primary areas: - the architectural heritage; - the archaeological heritage; and - the movable heritage. Consideration is given to integrated approaches to conservation, in particular those which take into account the global concept of sustainable development and the need for community involvement in formulating legal and institutional mechanisms. This publication is part of a series launched in 2000 on topics of general interest, based on experience acquired through pilot projects in different countries, and

made available to all those involved in heritage in the member states of the Council of Europe.

D.2 UNESCO's Culture for Development Indicator Suite for Bosnia and Herzegovina Presented

UNESCO's Culture for Development Indicator Suite for Bosnia and Herzegovina was officially presented on July 5, 2011 as the sole document which recognizes importance and contribution of culture in development of Bosnia and Herzegovina. According to the research, contribution of cultural activities to GDP of B-H in 2009 was 6.7% or 1.6 billion BAM. The expenditure for culture on all levels of government in B-H in 2009 was 123,4 million BAM or 36 BAM per capita.

This research was financed by the Spanish Agency for International Development AECID and was conducted by UNESCO within the MDG-F Programme Culture for Development. The Culture for Development Programme is implemented by three UN agencies: UNESCO, UNICEF and UNDP in partnership with Ministry of Civil Affairs of B-H, Ministry of Culture and Sports of FBiH and Ministry of Education and Culture of RS. Programme is financed by the Government of Kingdom of Spain through Millennium Development Goals Achievement Fund (MDG-F).

"The Newark Museum in Newark, NJ, has announced a \$1 million grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation to support a major expansion and reinstallation of its African art collection. The grant will be used to fund new curatorial and research positions as well as the first-ever catalogue of the museum's pioneering collection of more than 4,000 African artworks. The museum began acquiring the pieces in the collection in 1914, five years after its founding, and in 1926 mounted one of the first museum exhibitions of African art. Last year the museum unveiled 'Present Tense: Arts of Contemporary Africa,' the first permanent collection gallery devoted to contemporary African art in the United States." <http://bit.ly/q9gc8o>

Federal Labor Statistics: Arts Jobs Predicted to Grow at Eleven Percent - Miller-McCune

"Using data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the National Endowment for the Arts projects a growth rate of 11 percent for arts-related occupations over the next seven years. Perhaps surprisingly, that's a bit higher than the projected increase of 10 percent for the overall labor force. Granted, the figure is lower than many other fields in the 'professional and related occupations' category, such as the 72 percent projected increase in jobs for biomedical engineers. Nevertheless, the need for qualified professionals in many arts-related occupations is expected to grow as fast, or faster, than the job market as a whole." <http://bit.ly/qHs6tO>
